

Campbell's *Labels for Education* Program (New!)

Americans from every state have been collecting Campbell's *Labels For Education* for many years, and now the Oregon State Grange Community Service Department will to!!

The way it will work here in Oregon is:

- Each Grange will have their members cut and save the UPC Bar Code and the part attached to the UPC Bar Code that says, "Clip and Earn *nn* points For Your School." "Labels For Education." If your Grange puts on dinners or break-fasts, your Grange can save the UPC Bar Codes too!
- Once collected, you have two (2) options for what you do with them. You can:
 - ✓ Count the points/labels, then contact a nearby school and turn them in to the school. (*Remember to ask for a receipt from the school!!*)
 - ✓ Save them, count them, and bring the labels to the annual state session, where we will count them, give your Grange credit for them and distribute the labels to any Grange who wants them in the county where the annual state session occurs. These labels will be distributed on a "First Come-First Served" basis.
- Any Grange that collects at least 500 points/labels will receive a Certificate of Recognition at the next state session! We will ask for the receipt proof that at least 500 points/labels have been turned in at the school.
- Please note: It is not necessary to save and bring in the **entire** label from the product. We only want the UPC Bar Code part.
- Campbell's Family of Brands include, of course, all of the **Campbell's Soup** products, but also **Prego, V-8, Pepperidge**

Farms, Bic, Pop Secret, Swanson, Wolfgang Puck, SpaghettiOs, Select Harvest, Franco-American and Post products. Plus, depending on the label, you can earn 1, 5 or even 10 points per label!

- We have added a category on the Semi-Annual Report forms for the collection of the Campbell's Labels.
- For more than 37 years, Campbell's *Labels for Education* has been awarding free educational equipment to schools in exchange for proofs of purchase (UPC Bar Codes) from the Campbell family of brands. It's a fun, easy program where students, families and members of the community work together for a common goal.
- Today, over 60,000 schools and organizations are registered with *Labels for Education*, benefiting more than 42 million students. Over the years, they have been able to provide more than \$110 million in merchandise to America's schools!
