

How to Set Grange Policy

- Pick a problem in your community that could be solved by a change in public policy.
- Check your state and/or national legislative policies handbooks to see if the Grange already has a policy on the issue.
- If not, or if the policy is not working, research the issue so that you have background information.
- Hold a “town hall meeting” at the Grange hall to gather additional information and generate support for your issue.
- Write a resolution stating your preferred public policy position on the issue.
- Submit the resolution to the Grange for approval.
- If it is adopted, ask a legislator to introduce it in a legislative bill.

How to Write a Resolution

Whereas this is where the background information is written; and
Whereas this is where the problem is described; therefore be it
Resolved that this is the proposed solution to the problem; and, be it further
Resolved that this is the action to be taken.
