

Grange Leadership Team

The Grange Leadership Team will consist of six Grange members who will serve a two-year term, performing a variety of leadership activities. These members may be asked to present workshops, speeches, help with degree days, put on floor work demonstrations and be true role models for the Grange. The following process will be used to select the members of the Grange Leadership Team:

- Their Subordinate/Community Grange must certify all applicants as eligible. This certification will be evidence by submitting a completed application form, which has been signed by the applicant, the Subordinate/Community Grange Youth Chairperson, and the Subordinate/Community Master. If the Subordinate/Community Grange does not have a Youth Chairperson, the application must be signed by the Pomona Youth Chairperson. A Subordinate/Community Grange may certify as many applicants as they feel are qualified.
- Each applicant will be expected to present a workshop during state Grange session on any Grange or leadership topic that is not to exceed 30 minutes in length. A copy of this workshop must accompany the application. The applicant must arrange all special equipment prior to the workshop.
- Each applicant will be required to submit two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a member of their Subordinate/Community Grange
- Applications must be sent to the State Youth Co-Directors by **May 15**.
- The State Youth Committee with the help of the State Master will appoint a three-person panel of judges to review and rank the applicants based on their written application, letters of recommendation and their workshop.

- The winners will be announced Thursday evening of state session at the youth banquet.
- Each winner will receive a plaque.

Youth throughout Oregon

- The State Youth Committee will plan a Subordinate/Community involvement project to take place during the state session. During that selected time, Grange members who wish to participate will perform whatever activity has been planned (serving meals, cleaning, painting, etc.).
