Egg and Milk Cartons Toys

Cut egg cartons into individual cups and make them look like flowers. Use a pipe cleaner as a stem.

The children can also make puppets out of egg cartons and pipe cleaners. Milk cartons can be transformed into great building blocks or a train.

To make the blocks, simply cut the top off two cartons and push them together. The blocks can be covered with contact paper.

To make a train, cut the top off of the carton and cover with contact paper. For wheels, glue four egg carton cups on the bottom of each "car" of the train.

The cars can be connected with string or yarn.

What you need:

2 parts flour
1 part salt
1 part water
food coloring

What you do:

Mix and knead until it is doughy and the color is mixed in well. Store in a covered container.

Oil Blob Dance

What You Need:

- Clear drinking glass or plastic cup
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup rubbing alcohol
- Cooking oil
- Eyedropper
- Food coloring (optional)

Instructions:

Watch an oil blob dance between two other liquids! Here's what to do:

Pour the water into the glass.

Add a drop or two of food coloring to the water so you can tell which liquid is the water. (optional)

Tilt the glass slightly and slowly pour in the rubbing alcohol. Don't shake the glass, or the two liquids will mix. This is the clear liquid on top of the colored water.

Fill the eyedropper with the cooking oil and lower the tip into the layer of rubbing alcohol, but not into the water.

Magic Milk

What You Need:

- Whole milk
- Food coloring
- Liquid dish soap
- Shallow pan (like a pie pan)

Instructions:

Pour whole milk in a pie pan, and allow the milk to warm to room temperature.

Place a few drops of different colored food coloring into the pan of milk.

Next, place a few drops of liquid dish soap into the pan of milk.

Watch what happens.

NOTE:

The soap breaks down the fat in the milk and causes the food coloring to swirl and make some really neat designs.

Working Parents

My spouse and I both work. How will this affect our family?

Not too many years ago in the typical American family, only the father worked outside the home. Usually the mother was the homemaker and was there to greet the children when they returned home from school each day. But there have been dramatic changes in that picture.

Millions of families find that they need two wage-earners in order to buy a home, pay the rent, afford vacations or simply to maintain the family budget. In most communities, two-working-parent families are no longer exceptional.

The Impact of Working

When both parents are occupied with their jobs for eight or more hours per day, there are obvious effects on the family. On the positive side, the family has an increased income and thus fewer financial stresses. Also, when both parents work, there is a potential for greater equality in the roles of husband and wife. Depending on the nature of the parents' work, as well as the family's values, fathers may assume more responsibility for child care and housework than has traditionally been the case. With their wives out in the workplace, men find it easier to define a greater role for themselves in child-raising. This is particularly evident when parents have staggered work schedules - for instance, if the father works daytime hours and is home after school and in the evening, while the mother works a shift such as 4:00 p.m. to midnight. Dad may then be in charge of preparing dinner, cleaning up the kitchen and helping the children with their homework.

Avoiding Burnout

Some parents feel terrible strain and fatigue as they try to juggle their responsibilities at home and at work. If you are starting to feel burned out, here are some ideas to help you ease the pressure.

- Throughout your workday, fit some relaxing moments into your routine. Close your office door for 10 minutes, shut your eyes and perform a relaxation exercise. Or during your coffee breaks, forgo coffee and doughnuts and take a short walk instead. Diversions like these can reduce stress, improve efficiency on the job, and make you feel more vitalized when you return home in the evening, thus creating a more amicable family life.
- If you regularly come home tired, try to develop rituals that improve your frame of mind when you arrive home. This may mean spending some time by yourself in order to put a distance between you and the day's stresses. Coming home is an important moment that should be taken seriously. Your children are eager to be with you and to share their day's experiences.
- Assess how you are spending your time during the day. Look for areas in which you can reduce stress. For instance, can you bring in dinner two or three nights a week? Can you hire a high school or college student to help for an hour or two in the evenings, perhaps doing the laundry or cleaning up the kitchen? If you can save a couple of hours a night this way, you will have more time to spend with your children and/or to relax or sleep.
- Involve the entire family in the evening responsibilities that are such a drain on your time and energy. For example, the family can work together to clean up the kitchen after dinner; with everyone's help it will get done much quicker and free up some time for you in the evening. Do the same on the weekends too: If the house needs cleaning, have everyone pitch in on Saturday morning; this will help build family cohesiveness while finishing the job faster, thus leaving more time for enjoyable family activities.
- Keep your expectations realistic. On certain evenings you might have to choose between going to the market and doing the laundry. Some tasks just may have to wait until the weekend.
- On the weekends, schedule some relaxation time for yourself. Go for a walk or go to the gym. Do some recreational reading. While family time is important and certain chores need to be done, time to unwind and recharge your own batteries is essential too.

The Legacy Project's Grandparents Day Planning & Activity Guide covers everything from the [history](#) of National Grandparents Day to different models for running a successful intergenerational event to over 200 great [activities](#), like Then & Now fill-in sheets, Storytelling ideas, Family Tree charts, a Fill-in-the-Blanks Life Story booklet and Generations Scrapbook, Greatest Grandparent/Grandfriend certificates, and much more.

A Grandparents Day event can involve both biological grandparents and "grandfriends" or other older adult mentors. It's a celebration of the value of all generations and the special relationships between them. Your event can include both one-on-one and group activities.

This guide is directed primarily at schools, but the ideas can also be used by community and seniors groups.

Goals and Benefits

As you're planning your Grandparents Day event, keep these goals and benefits in mind:

- Give children an opportunity to show their appreciation and love for their grandparents, and other significant older people in their lives.
- Give grandparents an opportunity to show their love and caring for their grandchildren, as well as other children in their community.
- Create "a memory" – an enjoyable, memorable experience for children and their grandparents.
- Honor older adults and give them validation in their role of grandparent (or "grandfriend" or mentor). Grandparents need to know that they are making a difference in the lives of younger generations.
- Give older adults a chance to share some of their life experiences with their own grandchildren and other children, and expose children to the information and guidance older people can offer. Older people want to make a difference in the lives of those that follow. A sense of legacy is a basic human need.
- Make children and adults – especially parents and teachers – aware of the strengths of older people, and confront some of the stereotypes we often hold toward aging and older adulthood.
- Encourage and support long-term, mutually-supportive, caring intergenerational relationships. Grandparents will appreciate any concrete ideas and resources you provide to help them build and maintain a connection with the young.
- Give grandparents an opportunity to see firsthand what children are doing in today's schools and meet the teachers. The education system has to be made real and relevant to older adults.
- Foster community relations and boost family involvement in schools. Children whose families – parents and grandparents – are involved in their education learn better. Schools get much needed additional support.

- Encourage older adults to fulfill a social role and responsibility by volunteering in schools and acting as mentors, which benefits children and can transform a beleaguered education system.
- By doing activities leading up to and then after the event, expose children to new ideas from a historical, multigenerational, and life course perspective.

Create a community that remembers its history as it builds its future. Young and old can find wisdom and inspiration in each other.

A Grandparents Day event is an opportunity. We divide up our communities and our activities by age – young people in schools, older people in retirement communities or facilities. We talk a lot about all the ways we need to "help" older people. But, perhaps, the old can help us. It's the experience of life in a multigenerational, interdependent, richly complex community that, more than anything else, teaches us how to be human.

We are a culture that values the "new" and "youth." If we can improve the standing of older adults in society, and nurture what they can bring through intergenerational connections, then we can achieve a better community with a better quality of life for all ages.

Young and old together can exist in a moment of time that's the grand sum of past, present, and future. Rather than time being the enemy – rushing time or stressing to fit as much into time as possible – time becomes a comfortable companion, a circle rather than a line. Young and old together complete the grand circle of life.
